- The National Service Inclusion Project (NSIP) was launched to ensure that individuals with disabilities who want to serve have that opportunity
- Vermont Commission on National and Community Service (VTCNCS)
 currently administers five AmeriCorps programs with over eighty members
- VTCNCS employs a Disability Coordinator who can help you maximize your service experience, answer any questions you may have about providing reasonable accommodations, and guide you through the possibilities of volunteerism
